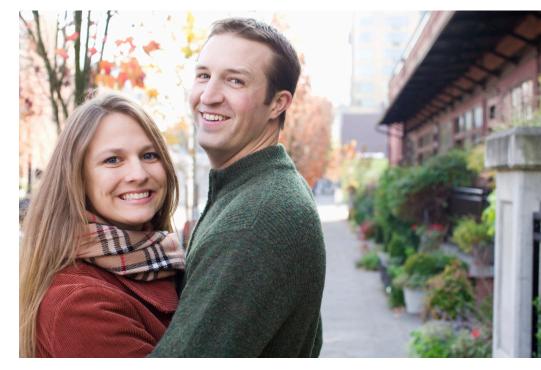
# Never too old!
